About us

Cricket Players' Association of Moulvibazar United Kingdom (CPAM UK) is a non-profitable alliance of British Bangladeshi cricketers, from the district of Moulvibazar. The association was originally formed in Bangladesh (2007), in order to promote, develop and protect the rights of cricketers. CPAM UK was thus formed in 2016 adhering to the same principles with the additional purpose of bringing various social media groups of ex-players together.

The primary objective of the association is to ensure the continuous development of cricketers and to preserve the rich heritage of our composite culture. The association also intends to organise related sporting activities and to promote the association, reaching out to all age groups in the UK.

In its current phase, the association has successfully held several tournaments across the UK, including: London, Birmingham, Bristol, Cardiff and Portsmouth. Furthermore, it has managed to arrange other sporting and charitable activities, providing aid to flood victims in Moulvibazar.

General members are the sole of the organisation and provide funding on yearly basis by registering with the organisation.

CPAMUK has a twenty-one-member management committee and seven-member advisory committee. The management committee is elected by the general members every two years from registered members.

The foundation of cricket in Moulvibazar

When requested by CPAM-UK to write something about the history of Moulvibazar Upazilla cricket, I was taken by surprise as I had left Moulvibazar to go abroad nearly 3 decades ago. My memories of that time had become blurry and for that reason I thought I'd better ask someone who could help me on that subject. Our accounts span up to 1990 as after that we had left Bangladesh for the UK. The secretary of the CPAM-UK, Numan Ahmed Doel advised me that he was more than happy for me to consult with a second person and jointly create a piece of writing. My childhood friend Suhel Ahmed Chowdhury, whose memory is a lot stronger than my own and who was very much like me in his time with cricket was the best person to refer with whilst writing this. Mr. Chowdhury and I have tried to present the history of Moulvibazar Upazilla cricket as accurately as possible according to our memory capacity. Even in our hundred attempts, there may be some mistakes or teams/individuals that we have missed out and for this we apologise in advance. It would be a good point to make that if there is anything that we have missed in our account then this can be added in the future.

Here we are focusing on the various clubs, organisers, umpires and commentators. These people played very important roles in officiating and organizing, but most importantly cricket was their main passion. In this episode we will concentrate more on the cricket organisers as opposed to the cricketers, however a future episode will be dedicated to the cricket players.

After liberation there was a scarce number of teams in Moulvibazar. Some of the teams that were active were known as:

Kalimabad Crira Chakra, Eleven Stars, YCC, Friends, Young Pegasus, Mukthi Shena of Muslim Quarter, Old Hospital Road, Confidence and Unbeaten Eleven.

Let's begin with the Kalimabad Crira Chakra. This club was formally founded before 1978. Some of the key people were Anwar Akhter Chowdhury (Sheuli), Jalal Uddin Chowdhury (Zaheer), Ziaul Islam Khan (Rumen), Abul Kashem, Suhel Ahmed Chowdhury and among others.

One of the big names in Moulvibazar cricket was Eleven Stars. The club was originally founded for football but also became a big name in Moulvibazar cricket. The main personalities for this club's cricket matters were the likes of the Late Humayun Bhai (Muslim Quarter), Sabbir Bhai, Sadiq Bhai, Shairu Bhai and the ever present Rai-

Moving on to another well-known cricket club named 'Friends'. This club also greatly contributed to the cricket scene in Moulvibazar. Important names to mention who played an influential role in organising this club are late Joshim Bhai, Zakir Bhai, Jamshed Bhai, Babul Bhai, Young Pegasus cricket club was also another common name in Moulvibazar cricket. Some key names to point out who greatly helped organising this club are Nadu Bhai, Mukul Bhai Shammu Bhai, Flower Bhai and there are some others.

YCC also became a well-known cricket club locally at the time. Many local youngsters played cricket under the club. Humayun bhai (Shomsernogor Road) was one of the key people who ran the club.

Energetic youths from Muslim Quarter came together to create a club and became known as Mukthi Shena and like the other clubs became well known in Moulvibazar cricket. Some of the club officials included Ex Councillor Azmol Chowdhury, Liakot Bhai, Jamil Bhai, Late Lutfur Rahman Tarafder (Belal) and many others.

Old Hospital Cricket Club were a club that regularly practiced and played friendly games with each other in order to play against other local clubs. Faisal Chowdhury, currently living in Canada, led this club among others.

Some prominent cricket organisers formed a club in the mid-80s. The clubs name was called Weymas, the organisers names are Nazrul Bhai, Sadiq Bhai, Zakir Bhai and many others.

Confidence cricket club was founded in 1985 by Redwan Ahmed, Nizam Ahmed and Raihan Ahmed. The founding individual was Mahbub Isdani (Imran).

Late Badol Kanti Dev and others found a cricket club named Anondo Dara, originating from the Soyarpoor area.

The Unbeaten Eleven Cricket Club was established in 1990. Numan Ahmad Doel, the councillor current of Moulvibazar Pouroshoba Nahid Hossain, Imran Ibnur Hossain and Zubair Ahmed Shiblu were some of the main organisers for this club. There were a group of boys that had the ethnicity of British Bangladeshi. They lived in the UK but regularly went back to Bangladesh where they played cricket and tried their very best to help improve local cricket as much as they could. Their names were Ferdous Bari Bhai, Abdus Salam and Manjur Mushad.

Now, let's look at those who performed the most challenging task of the game. Umpires are always in the frontline of discussion and at that time, hardworking individuals such as Late Abu Bhai, Ex Councillor Azmol Bhai, Liakoth Bhai, Late Bulbul Bhai, Harun Bhai, Shipu Qureshi Bhai, Bulu Bhai provided fantastic officiating allowing everybody to enjoy their game of cricket.

We would like to show our gratitude to the Moulvibazar Pouroshoba who provided us with the facilities to play our games such as maintaining the pitches and providing the equipment to do this. The Pouroshoba chairman's Late Alhaj Sajjadur Rahman (Putul) and Ex Honourable Minister Late Sayed Mohshin Ali were instrumental in this. This gratitude also extends to the Moulvibazar District Sports Council for their support during this period, especially from Late Alhaj Komruzzaman and Alhaj Joynal Hussain.

A huge milestone for our District was the achievement of having an Under 19's team entered into the National Championship for the first time in 1990. This was Moulvibazars first opportunity to represent itself as a District team.

As mentioned at the beginning, this episode was mainly to recognise the community at the time however we have not gone into the specifics of any individual players. They of course were one of the biggest elements of the cricketing scene at that time however we also understand that there were so many individuals that we couldn't possibly cover all of them in this small edition. We hope that in the future we or someone else can touch on the subject of all of our players.

Last, but not least we were grateful enough to have commentators such as the Late Abu Bhai and Daniel sir Bulu Bhai who provided their insight into the games. There were also many other members of the community who provided their amazing support and members of other sports who also supported our games. Similarly, we cannot mention every single of them in this episode but we thank them all for their commitments and contributions to the

Since the independence of Bangladesh, a lot of people who were involved in Moulvibazar cricket have sadly passed away. A few have been mentioned here however there are many other who also contributed greatly to cricket and to them we extend our gratitude.

Finally, we are grateful to CPAM-UK for allowing us the opportunity to share our insight into cricket in Moulvibazar at that time. If the opportunity arises in the future, we will be delighted to write more about Moulvibazar cricket and share our experiences with you all.
